Doors are solid hardwood or metal-clad.
Door hinges are protected from removal from the outside.
Windows in the door or within 40 inches of the locks have been reinforced.
All doors are secured by a deadbolt lock with a minimum 1-inch throw.







Doors are equipped with 4-inch strike plate.
Doors are equipped with 180 degree viewer. □ □

All windows have adequate locks.
Windows have screens. □ □
